### Riding Changes / Jockey Information

Prior to the running of the first race, Stewards on their routine track inspection had concerns with a section of the track surface just past the crossing, where there had been a lawn mower malfunction and the grass was cut to ground level. Although the track staff had placed grass clippings on the area, the stewards were not satisfied with the different coloring between the two surfaces and the softer footing. The stewards had concerns for riders and horses' safety in coming to this decision. Stewards after discussing this matter with the Tas Racing track staff and consulting with Mr. K Ring (Jockeys association representative) came to the decision that the running rail will be required to be moved about 1.5 meters outwards and approximately 160 meters in length at this point to miss the area of concern. This was undertaken by the Tas racing track staff and others to achieve this prior to the first race.

Stewards inspected the new running rail and deemed the area safe for racing.

### **RACE 1 –12.25 PM – WINNING EDGE PRESENTATIONS MAIDEN - 3YO UP- (SW) – 1600 METRES**

#### **2. CATCH A BREAK -**

A post race swab sample was taken from this winner for analytical testing.

#### **3. DARK NIGHT -**

Raced three wide throughout with cover.

- 4. LOST LOGIC -** Restrained making the 1200 meter turn. Stewards ordered a veterinarian examination of the gelding as it failed to run on over the concluding stages. Post race examination revealed no obvious abnormalities at the time of inspection. Trainer advised the stewards that the gelding may be retired.
- 5. NO MORE ROCKS -** Held up for a clear run at the 450 meters and attempted to shift another horse outwards to gain a clear run. It had to be restrained off heels because of the runner in front rolling outwards making the turn.
- 6. OXY BOLT -** It was slow to begin. Worked forward and raced three wide throughout.
- 7. IN THE CLOUDS -** Caught racing wide and restrained to the rear making the 1200 meter turn.
- 8. SIENA WOLF -** Momentarily eased by its rider entering the front straight.
- 9. SKELMORLIE -** It was slow to begin.
- 10. TALK SOON -** Stewards ordered a post race veterinarian examination as the mare failed to run on over the final 200 meters after leading throughout the event. Post race examination revealed no obvious abnormalities at the time of inspection.

Stewards questioned trainer Siggy Carr in relation to the improved performance of the winner CATCH A BREAK. Trainer Carr explained that adding a visor on the gelding may have contributed to the performance. The trainer also explained that today's improved track surface and a good ride by the apprentice would have also been a contributing factor, along with the class of the race suited the gelding today. Stewards were satisfied with the explanation and noted the trainer's comments for future reference.

#### **RACE 2 – 1.01 PM – KEVIN SHARKIE MAIDEN – 3 YO & UP – (SW) - 1100 METERS**

- 1. CARDIOSPHERE -** Bumped and inconvenienced at the start resulting in heavy contact with another runner.
- 2. GEEGEES DOWNPOUR -** Over raced in the early stages. Laid out under pressure in the home straight.
- 3. LIGHT FORCE -** Rider accidentally dropped his whip at the 250 meters.
- 4. OUTBUSH -** Jumped inwards at the start.
- 5. SORELL LAD -** Tended to lay inwards after entering the front straight resulting in the rider having to straighten.
- 6. TRIBAL COUNCIL -** Inconvenienced upon jumping and was taken inwards bumping another runner. Was caught racing wide.
- 7. LUNA LINDT -** It was severely hampered upon jumping and shortly after resulted in the rider becoming unbalanced.
- 9. SUNRISE AT KIRRA-10. TEAH -** Had to be resaddled behind the barriers. Stewards agreed for the rider to ride the gelding ½ kg over its allotted weight. Shifted outwards upon jumping.
- 12. GEEGEES MISSILE-** A post ace swab sample was taken from this winner for analytical testing.
- 13. NUNKERI -** Stewards ordered a post race veterinary examination as the filly failed to run on over the concluding stages and performed below market expectation. Post race veterinary examination revealed the filly was suffering from an atrial fibrillation. The trainer was advised that the filly will be required to perform a 1000-meter gallop in front of the stewards and undertake an ECG test prior to being nominated to race again.

### **RACE 4 – 2.21 PM – LADBROKES SRM IN MULTIS – CLASS 1 HANDICAP - 1200 METRES**

| <b>1. MAGIC MOGUL -</b>     | Tended to over race in the early and middle stages of the event. Momentarily held up for a clear run at the 450 meters. Stewards received a phone call from the trainer to report that on returning to his stable the gelding showed signs of blood to both nostrils. Stewards acting under provisions of AR 79 (6) barred the gelding from racing as it is its second offence under this rule. |
| <b>2. SWANNEY DEE -</b>     | Had to be shifted wider in the home straight to gain a clear run and ran home strongly. Laid in under pressure over the concluding stages.  |
| <b>5. CAPTAIN TAZ -</b>     | Restrained shortly after the start to gain a position closer to the rails.  |
| <b>6. RAINBOW ALLEY -</b>   | Over raced in the middle stages of the event.   |
| <b>7. PHERE THE GIRLS -</b> | Reared upon jumping and was slow into stride. Raced wide throughout. Tended to lay inwards under pressure in the home straight. A post race swab sample was taken from this winner for analytical testing.  |
| <b>9. RARE ORO -</b>        | Raced 5 wide until the 600 meters.  |
| <b>11. GAZZA'S SPIRIT -</b> | Was held up for a clear run rounding the home turn.   |

| <b>1. ISLAND WARRIOR -</b>   | Tended to shift outwards under pressure over the concluding stages. A post race swab sample was taken from this winner for analytical testing.                                       |
| <b>2. COASTAL STRIKE -</b>   | Tended to over race while leading the event.   |
| <b>3. MANHATTAN NIGHTS -</b> | Began slowly.  |
| <b>4. SNOW EAGLE -</b>       | Tended to over race in the middle stages of the event. laid in under pressure in the home straight.  |
| <b>6. VALIANT KHAN -</b>     | Trapped racing wide in the early stages of the event.  |
| <b>8. NATIVE CLAN -</b>      | Stewards agreed for the rider to ride the gelding 1 kg over its allotted minimum weight of 54 kg. Restrained at the start from a wide barrier to gain a position closer to the rail. |
| <b>10. MARTINI BLUE -</b>    | Raced 3 wide throughout the event.   |

awkwardly and had to be restrained off heels approaching the 800 meters after over racing. A post race swab sample was taken from this winner for analytical testing.

Tended to over race in the early stages of the event.

**10. MANDATE -**

Tended to over race in the early and middle stages of the event. Rounding the 1200 meter turn had to be restrained off the heels of the runners in front.

Showed early speed to lead the event. A post race veterinarian examination was called as the gelding failed to run on over the concluding stages which revealed no obvious abnormalities.

**RACE 7 – 4.15 PM – LIFE MEMBER KEVIN SHARKIE – BM 72 HANDICAP - 1000 METRES**

**2. JEHBENTI -**

It was slow to begin.

**4. ZANY GIRL -**

Became fractious in the barriers prior to the start. As the gates opened the filly struck the side of the barriers which resulted in her being slow into stride. Laid inwards under pressure over the concluding stages of the event.

A post race swab sample was taken from this filly after its winning performance for analytical testing.

**6. GINGERSON -**

Tended to lay inwards under pressure in the home straight.

**7. FEAR THE STING -**

Became fractious in the barriers. Rider accidentally dropped his whip at the 200 meters.

**8. PERIWINKLE -**

Showed early speed to lead the event.

**RACE 8 – 4.50 PM – LADBROKES FORM GENIUS – BM 68 HCP- 2200 METRES**

**1. GEE GEE MISS  
QUITA -**

Bumped shortly after the start.

**2. HAPPY CLAN -**

Bumped by another runner upon jumping. A post race swab sample was taken from this winner for analytical testing.

**3. SUGOI LEGEND -**

Raced 3 wide until the 700 meters. Disappointed for a run approaching the home turn.

**4. MATEUS -**

It was slow to begin.

**5. TAHITIAN WARRIOR**

Bumped by another runner upon jumping and carried wider. Raced keenly while leading the event. Failed to run on over the concluding stages.

**6. ALPINE KATE -**

Stewards agreed for the rider to ride the mare ½ kg over its allotted 54 kg allotted weight. Jumped outwards at the start, bumping another runner. Tended to over race in the early and middle stages and got its head up. Failed to run on over the concluding stages.
