RACE 1 – KEVIN SHARKIE MAIDEN (1100 METRES)

| 3 LUCKY COUNTRY | Got his head up and raced keenly in the early stages. |
| 4 SORELL EAGLES | Jumped out and bumped with MISS STRAT. |
| 5 TIMELY NEEDS | Jumped awkwardly and slow to muster. |
| 7 MISS STRAT | Crowded and hampered for galloping room at approximately the 50m mark when LUCKY COUNTRY laid in under pressure and SORELL EAGLES shifted out and brushed with MISS STRAT. |

Approaching the 150m MISS STRAT shifted in marginally and made light contact with SORELL EAGLES. Thereafter, approaching the 100m MISS STRAT which commenced to weaken was tightened for galloping room and could not be fully tested in the concluding stages when positioned between LUCKY COUNTRY which laid in and shifted in away from the whip and SORELL EAGLES which improved on the outside of LAWRENNY BOYS and brushed MISS STRAT. Jockey D Pires (LUCKY COUNTRY) and Apprentice J Johnstone (SORELL EAGLES) were advised that while there were circumstances surrounding this incident, they are obliged to straighten their mounts when necessary and to ensure that they are not an undue influence on other horses.

RACE 2 – AVISO TAS INSURANCE BROKERS MAIDEN (1430 METRES)

| 1 GOLD TIANNA | Slow to jump. |
| 4 RAIDER'S OWN | Laid in under pressure in the concluding stages. |
| 5 VOSTOK STATION | Brushed the inside running rail at approximately the 50m mark. |
| 6 WALKING STREET | Crowded for galloping room between WOUNDED EAGLE which commenced to lay out under pressure and RAIDER'S OWN in the concluding stages. |
| 7 WOUNDED EAGLE | Raced wide from the 1000m to approximately the 600m. Over the concluding stages the gelding tended to lay out under pressure. |
| 8 BIG OLIVE | Raced wide until approximately the 800m mark. Raced wide rounding the home turn. |
| 11 WHATS NEW PUSSYCAT | A post-race veterinary examination of the mare revealed there to be no abnormalities. |

RACE 3 – LADBROKES ODDS SURGE CLASS 1 HCP (1430 METRES)

| 3 LIVE ON LOVE | Difficult to settle in the early stages. |
| 4 ALPINE HONEY | Leaving the 400m after it had raced prominently and commenced to give ground, had to steady when awkwardly placed on the heels of LIVE ON LOVE which shifted in slightly and on the outside of FRUIT OF DE VINE which shifted out marginally.
The Stewards after interviewing Apprentice J Johnstone and Jockeys T Baker and C Van Munster formed the opinion that there were contributing factors to this incident, and the benefit of the doubt will be afforded to Apprentice J |

Johnstone in this case. The riders however were reminded of their obligation to maintain a straight course and not be an undue influence on other horses in races.

7 SOUTH GEORGIA

Steadied off the heels of RAPIDS AHEAD at the 300m and then raced in restricted galloping room and could not be fully tested

9 ALPINE JOY

Raced wide through-out.

10 MASTER OF MISCHIEF

Slow away.

RACE 4 – WINNING EDGE PRESENTATIONS MAIDEN/CLASS 1 (2040 METRES)

4 RIPPEN GOLD

Stood flat footed at the start and was slow away.

10 STAR PERFORMER

Slow into stride.

11 THE TAZWEGIAN

Jumped awkwardly. Laid out under pressure in the home straight.

RACE 5 – HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY! CLASS 3 HCP (1600 METRES)

2 TIDEFORD (NZ)

A post-race veterinary examination of the gelding revealed no abnormalities.

5 SKELMORLIE

Slow to muster.

7 MATEUS

At the 100m shifted out slightly and reacted when it was accidentally struck on the head by the whip of the rider of BERSERKER when it shifted in slightly. The Stewards were satisfied there was no intent surrounding this incident but nevertheless advised both riders to use more care in future.

8 QUAFFTIDE

Carried wide rounding the home turn by HIGH TAIL EAGLE which laid out on the turn.

10 NATIVE CLAN

Rider D Pirez advised Stewards he would be riding + 1kg.

14e STEELE MY SUNSHINE

A post-race veterinary examination of the mare revealed no abnormalities.

Following Race 5 all Riders that were present at the race meeting were addressed by the Head of Stewarding and Chief Stipendiary Steward. They were reminded of their obligations in relation to riding their mounts to the finish line with sufficient vigour and determination, the requirement to report any circumstances which might affect the performance of their mounts and the guidelines pertaining to the use of their whip. Riders were also reminded of the need for improved Boardroom etiquette including the dress code and conduct while in the Stewards room. Riders were advised that regular interactions will take place between the Stewards and the President of the Jockey's Association, who will act as the conduit for regular communication to attend to all matters that require consideration.

| 4 DIZZ BOOGIE TIME | A post-race Veterinary examination of the filly revealed no abnormalities. |
| 5 OUTBUSH | A post-race Veterinary examination of the filly revealed no abnormalities. |
| 6 WALTZING MATILDA | Held up for clear running until the final stages. |
| 10 COLLEEN'S CROWN | Raced wide through-out. |

RACE 7 – AVISO TAS PINK CUP DAY – MAY 24 BENCHMARK 64 HCP (1200 METRES)

| 1 GEE GEE ENUF SPEED | A post-race veterinary examination identified an irregular heart rhythm. An electrocardiography (ECG) of more than 60 seconds duration must be performed by a veterinarian whilst the horse is at rest; and a cardiac auscultation performed by a veterinarian within 15 minutes of the horse completing a satisfactory gallop of at least 1000m. |
| 3 TURK BOY | A post-race veterinary examination of the gelding revealed no abnormalities. |
| 4 SANDUAL | Raced wide throughout. Brushed with MATERIAL MADAM when shifting ground at the 200m. |
| 5 HALEN | Reared in barriers. Late scratching at 3:43pm on veterinary advice. A warning has been issued for barriers manners. |
| 6 MATERIAL MADAM | Brushed with SANDUAL at the 200m. |

10 THISISMYTURF

Raced wide rounding the home turn.

RACE 8 – KEVIN SHARKIE BENCHMARK 72 HCP (1600 METRES)

2 GEORGARONI

Brushed with ZEWINNA when in restricted galloping room between HURRICANE KETUT and SKY LAND at the 250m.

7 STEEL MIST

Jumped awkwardly and slow into stride.

8 MISS PEBBLES

A post-race veterinary examination of the mare revealed no abnormalities.
