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Physical Overview: The development of activities and assessment criteria to handle the greyhound conducting a physical assessment of their condition, including but not limited to handling various sensitive areas such as feet and around the mouth to assess the greyhound's acceptance to this activity. This is not a veterinary examination.							
Responses: The development of activities and assessment criteria to assess the greyhound's reaction to sudden unexpected loud noises, unusual and mild threatening behaviour.							
Prey Drive: The development of activities and assessment criteria to assess the greyhounds prey drive around other small animals, such as small dogs. The activity must ensure the safety of the small animal being used in the assessment.							
Resource Guarding: The development of activities and assessment criteria to assess the greyhound's reaction whilst in the possession of a resource, such as a small toy, whether they allow external interaction or removal of that resource without displaying signs of aggression. This activity should incorporate assessment using food items in addition to artificial items such as toys.							
Assessor Qualifications: An approved program must ensure that all assessors engaged to undertake a greyhound's assessment are suitably qualified.							
Records and Obligations An approved program must keep records of all greyhounds which have undergone assessment, including records relating to each of the assessment criteria and results. The Greyhounds must also be micro-chipped and de-sexed. These records may be subject to auditing by the Tasracing Integrity Unit and should contain the greyhound's microchip number. These records are to be made available upon request by the Tasracing Integrity Unit within a reasonable amount of time upon receiving such a request. The program/owner should adhere to any Local Council requirements or responsibilities under the Dog Control Act 2000. Adopting owners are to be advised that their details will be made available to TIU.							



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Additional supporting documentation of your rehoming program:

- Details of how the safety of assessors, greyhounds and other animals used in the process is ensured
- Detailed rehabilitation plan, including foster home periods and arrangements
- Details of any follow-up contact with adopting owners
- What processes are followed if the greyhound cannot be adopted due to:
 - (a) not meeting the assessment criteria or
 - (b) a new owner cannot be found
- Organisational charter
- Registration of Australian Company, Incorporated Association or Charitable Organisation
- Ability to provide a numbered organisational issued collar.
